## Haverhill on TV

A COMPUTING museum in Haverhill will play a prominent part in a Channel 5 documentary to be screened tomorrow evening.

The Centre For Computing History will appear on Brits Who Made The Modern World at 7.30pm, a show hosted by Peter Snow.

The episode focuses on the development of the computer game industry and the breakthrough release in the early 1980s of the first 3-D game, Acornsoft's Elite.

Raw Television, the show's producers, contacted the centre to locate the vintage computers needed to make the programme.

The museum was able to provide everything Raw required – including a BBC Micro, Acorn Atom and Apple II and one of its directors, Jason Fitzpatrick, so impressed producers with his skills and knowledge he was interviewed by Peter Snow and will appear on the show.

A 1980s office set was created at The Centre For Computing History for Mr Snow to use.
