Bid to bring history of computing museum to city

Two high-profile Cambridge technology businesses are spearheading the foundation of a Cambridge Computing History Museum.

Red Gate Software and ARM Holdings have both donated substantial funds to the project, which would see Haverhill's Centre for Computing History relocated to Cambridge.

The museum has more than 12,000 artefacts including the Altair 8800 – the first home computer.

Jason Fitzpatrick, chairman of the Board of Trustees, said: "This is a very exciting development.

"Cambridge is the natural home for a computing history museum in the UK."
