The QL, ZX80, ZX81, Spectrum and ICL OPD computers are among the exhibits on display at a museum dedicated to computing history on the borders of Cambridgeshire, Essex and Suffolk.

Jason Fitzpatrick had amassed a large collection of computers and realised this sort of project hadn't been done before, so with Elaine Collins he set up a committee of prominent people from Haverhill's business community, and together they launched the Centre for Computing History in February 2008.
